do not value or make  
doctrine a high priority  
in life.

**Prov 1:24, “Because I have called and you refused, I have stretched out my hand and no one regarded,**

**Prov 1:25, “Because you disdained all my counsel, and would have none of my rebuke,**

**Prov 1:26, “I also will laugh at your calamity; I will mock when your terror comes,**

**Prov 1:27, “When your terror comes like a storm, and your destruction comes like a whirlwind, when distress and anguish come upon you.**

**Prov 1:28, “Then they will call on me, but I will not answer; they will seek me diligently, but they will not find me.**

**Prov 1:29, “Because they hated knowledge and did not choose the fear of the LORD,**

**Psa 23:1, “A Psalm of David. The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want.”**

**Psa 23:4, “Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil; for You are with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me.”**
