Oἶδα, oida, complete knowledge, here, divine omniscience
Perfect: completed action, empasizes present results
Active: Christ performs the action

Indicative mood: presenting reality

ἔργον, *ergon*Plural indicates lifetime production

- a. Your labor [kopos] and endurance [hupomone]
- b. You cannot bear evils [bastazo] and you have tested [peirazo] their claims and found them liars
- c. You have endurance (n-hupomone) and persevered [bastazo] because of My name

κόπος *kopos*,

"toil resulting in weariness"
Used for Christian service

1 Corinthians 3:8, "Now he who plants and he who waters are one, and each one will receive his own reward according to his own labor."


