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νικάω *nikao* articular pres act ptcp "victors, winners, conquerors, overcomers." Cognate to the noun, νική, *nike*, "victory, success." *Nikao* "to overpower, to gain victory, to win."

John 16:33, "These things I have spoken to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world."


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νικάω nikao

The Characteristics of Worldliness

The Biblical concept of "worldliness" describes the collection of ideas, philosophies, religions, standards, values which characterize a culture or subculture as well as its goals and methods to achieve those ends. Its purpose is to suppress truth in unrighteousness and redefine reality to avoid the righteousness of God. As such, this worldview incorporates and is expressed in every aspect of a culture's views of the individual and social relationships, theories of knowledge and learning, expressions of reality in visual and performing arts, science, technology, literature, and law. When the Christian operates within this thought structure, even though it may overlap in many ways with a Biblical worldview, it is still classified as worldliness.

The Characteristics of Worldliness

Worldliness is the thought of the creature Lucifer in rebellion against God.

Arrogance → Promotion of self, the creature/creation becomes the ultimate reference point.

Antagonism Hostility toward God, His plan, thinking, and revelation.

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1 John 2:29, "If you know that He is righteous, you know that everyone who practices righteousness is born of Him."

1 John 3:9, "Whoever has been born of God does not sin, for His seed remains in him; and he cannot sin, because he has been born of God."

1 John 4:7, "Beloved, let us love one another, for love is of God; and everyone who loves is born of God and knows God."

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ποιέω poiéō;

Pres act ptcp, article, relative ptcp.

"to produce, to do, to make or manufacture something, to create, to do, cause, bring about, accomplish, perform."

Can imply practice, but the stronger word for practice is *prasso* "to perform an activity or skill regularly or habitually."

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No one can do genuine righteousness without having been born again.

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Galatians 5:16, "I say then: Walk in the Spirit, and you shall not fulfill the lust of the flesh."

1 John 4:7, "Beloved, let us love one another, for love is of God; and everyone who loves is born of God and knows God."

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Is knowing God and loving God synonymous with salvation, i.e., trusting Christ?

Or

Is it the result of spiritual growth after salvation?

1 John 2:15, "Do not love the world, nor the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him.

1 John 2:16, "For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh and the lust of the eyes and the boastful pride of life, is not from the Father, but is from the world."
