to bear witness; to give

testimony, to testify

with two genitives of content indicating a description

Acts 9:36, "At Joppa there was a certain disciple named Tabitha, which is translated Dorcas. This woman was <u>full</u> of good works and charitable deeds which she did."

Acts 11:24, "For he was a good man, <u>full of the Holy Spirit</u> and <u>of faith</u>. And a great many people were added to the Lord."

Acts 13:10, "and said, 'O <u>full of all deceit and all fraud,</u> you son of the devil, you enemy of all righteousness, will you not cease perverting the straight ways of the Lord?' "

Acts 19:28, "Now when they heard this, they were <u>full of wrath</u> and cried out, saying, 'Great is Diana of the Ephesians!'

Eph. 5:18, "And do not be drunk with wine, in which is dissipation; but be filled with the Spirit,"

Acts 6:4, "but we will give ourselves continually to prayer and to the ministry of the word."

προσκαρτερέω *proskartereō* fut act indic 1 plur

to persist in; to persevere in; to be constant in something Eph. 6:18; Col. 4:2 used of prayer

Col. 4:2, "Continue earnestly in prayer, being vigilant in it with thanksgiving;"

Acts 6:4, "'but we will give ourselves continually to prayer and to the ministry of the word.'

Acts 6:5, "And the saying pleased the whole multitude. And they chose Stephen, a man full of faith and the Holy Spirit, and Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolas, a proselyte from Antioch,"

Acts 6:6, "whom they set before the apostles; and when they had prayed, they laid hands on them."

Num. 27:22, "So Moses did as the LORD commanded him. He took Joshua and set him before Eleazar the priest and before all the congregation.

Num. 27:23, "And he laid his hands on him and inaugurated him, just as the LORD commanded by the hand of Moses."

Acts 6:7, "Then the word of God spread, and the number of the disciples multiplied greatly in Jerusalem, and a great many of the priests were obedient to the faith."

Acts 6:8, "And Stephen, full of faith and power, did great wonders and signs among the people."

2 Cor. 12:12, "Truly the signs of an apostle were accomplished among you with all perseverance, in signs and wonders and mighty deeds."

Acts 6:9, "Then there arose some from what is called the Synagogue of the Freedmen (Cyrenians, Alexandrians, and those from Cilicia and Asia), disputing with Stephen."
