denote correction which results in education.

Prov. 1:2, “To know wisdom and instruction, to perceive the words of understanding,

Prov. 1:3, “To receive the instruction of wisdom, justice, judgment, and equity;”

Prov. 1:7, “The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and instruction.
