

Rom. 10:3, "For they being ignorant of God's righteousness, and seeking to establish their own righteousness, have not submitted to the righteousness of God."

Sin — Death

Obedience ——— Righteousness

Rom. 6:17, "But God be thanked that [because] though you were slaves of sin, yet [but] you obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine to which you were delivered."

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έλευθερόω *eleutheroō* aor pass part masc plur nom to free, set free, release

Temporal: <u>when</u> you were set free from sin, you became slaves of righteousness

Rom. 6:19, "I speak in human terms because of the weakness of your flesh.

For just as you presented your members as slaves of uncleanness, and of lawlessness leading to more lawlessness, so now present your members as slaves of righteousness for sanctification."

Rom. 6:20, 'For when you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness.

Rom. 6:21, "What fruit did you have then in the things of which you are now ashamed? For the end of those things is death.

Rom. 6:22, 'But now having been set free from sin, and naving become slaves of God, you have your fruit to holiness, and the end, everlasting life.

Rom. 6:23, 'For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

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Rom. 6:23, "For the wages of <u>sin</u> is <u>death</u>, but the gift of God is <u>eternal life</u> in Christ Jesus our Lord."

1 Tim. 6:11, "But you, O man of God, flee these things and <u>pursue righteousness</u>, godliness, faith, love, patience, gentleness."

2 Tim. 2:22, "Flee also youthful lusts; but pursue righteousness, faith, love, peace with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart."

2 Tim. 4:8, "Finally, there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will give to me on that Day, and not to me only but also to all who have loved His appearing."

1John 3:7, "Little children, let no one deceive you. He who practices righteousness is righteous, just as He is righteous."

1 John 3:10, "In this the children of God and the children of the devil are manifest: Whoever does not practice righteousness is not of God, nor is he who does not love his brother."
