

5. Demon influence or demonic oppression can occur to anyone.

Demon influence is when a person is thinking according to the devil's thinking. This is described as "worldliness" in the Bible. A Christian or a non-Christian is demon-influenced when they operate according to any values, philosophies, religions, opinions, and world-views contrary to the divine viewpoint of the Bible.

6. Demon possession describes the invasion of the body of a non-Christian by a demon. The demon can control the unbeliever's physical actions from a position within the unbeliever.

Saul was not demon-possessed.

7. <u>New Testament Warnings About Demon</u> <u>Influence</u>

1 Cor. 10:20 says sacrificing to idols is sacrificing to demons

<u>1 Tim. 4:1</u> warns about deceitful spirits and doctrines of demons

<u>2 Cor. 11:14–15</u> warns of their deceptive appearance as servants of righteousness

<u>James 3:13–15</u> identifies human viewpoint or the worldly wisdom as demonic

Can a Christian Be . . . Demon Possessed?



Argument Against Demon Possession of a Christian

<u>Major Premise</u>: The Holy Spirit indwells every believer.

Minor Premise: A demon and the Holy Spirit cannot be in the same place.

CONCLUSION: Therefore a Christian cannot have both a demon and the Holy Spirit in the same place.

WRONG: Poorly constructed argument


1. The Indwelling of the Holy Spirit. Every believer in the Lord Jesus Christ is indwelt by the Holy Spirit from the instant of salvation (1 Cor. 3:16; 6:19). <u>1 Corinthians 3:16,</u> "Do you not know that you are the <u>temple</u> of God and *that* the Spirit of God dwells in you?"

<u>1 Corinthians 6:19</u>, "Or do you not know that your body is the <u>temple</u> of the Holy Spirit *who is* in you, whom you have from God, and you are not your own?"

hierón; includes not only the building, but the external grounds and courtyards


naos: Holy of holies

1 Cor. 3:16, "Do you not know that you are a temple of God and *that* the Spirit of God dwells in you?"

<u>1 Cor 6:19</u>, "Or do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit *who is* in you, whom you have from God, and you are not your own?"

Argument Against Demon Possession of a Christian

<u>Major Premise</u>: Every believer is a set apart sanctuary (by the Holy Spirit) for the indwelling Jesus Christ. <u>Minor Premise</u>: Unsanctified creatures (including demons) cannot enter into this kind of set apart sanctuary.

CONCLUSION: Demons cannot enter into the set apart sanctuaries of the believer's body.

<u>1 John 4:4, "Greater is He that is in you,</u> than he that is in the world." Matt. 12:28, "But if I cast out demons by the Spirit of God, then the kingdom of God has come upon you.

Matt. 12:29, "Or how can anyone enter the strong man's house and carry off his property, unless he first binds the strong man? And then he will plunder his house." Matt. 12:43, "Now when the unclean spirit goes out of a man, it passes through waterless places seeking rest, and does not find *it*.

Matt. 12:44, "Then it says, 'I will return to my house from which I came'; and when it comes, it finds *it* unoccupied, swept, and put in order." Matt. 12:45, "Then it goes and takes along with it seven other spirits more wicked than itself, and they go in and live there; and the last state of that man becomes worse than the first. That is the way it will also be with this evil generation."

<u>1 John 4:4</u>, "Greater is He that is in you, than he that is in the world."

John 17:15, "I do not pray that You should take them out of the world, but that You should keep them from the evil one." John 17:15, "I do not pray that You should take them <u>out of</u> the world, but that You should keep them from the evil one."

έκ ek "severance or separation"

The preposition $\hat{\epsilon}\kappa$ here is used to indicate severance or separation. Whatever else our Lord intended, this would exclude the invasion of a believer's body by unholy demons. Since we know the Father has heard and is fulfilling Christ's request, this must at least include protection of all believers, obedient and disobedient, from demon possession.

<u>1 John 5:18,</u> "We know that whoever is born of God does not sin; but he who has been born of God keeps himself, and the wicked one does not touch him.

<u>1 John 5:19</u>, "We know that we are of God, and the whole world lies *under the sway of* the wicked one."

<u>2 Thess. 3:3</u>, "the Lord is faithful, and He will strengthen and protect you from the evil one."


<u>2 Peter 1:3</u>, "as His divine power has given to us all things that *pertain* to life and godliness, through the knowledge of Him who called us by glory and virtue,

<u>2 Peter 1:4</u>, "by which have been given to us exceedingly great and precious promises, that through these you may be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption *that is* in the world through lust."

Can music deliver a person from demon oppression?

<u>1 Sam. 16:16</u>, "Let our master now command your servants, who are before you, to seek out a man who is a skillful player on the harp. And it shall be that he will play it with his hand when the distressing spirit from God is upon you, and you shall be well." <u>1 Sam. 16:23</u>, "And so it was, whenever the spirit from God was upon Saul, that David would take a harp and play it with his hand. Then Saul would become refreshed and well, and the distressing spirit would depart from him."

Music Therapy

1. A recent branch of psychology has developed a field called music therapy. The American Music Therapy Association defines Music Therapy as
