Temporal Realities

1. The Baptism by the Holy Spirit (BHS) is uniquely the work of the Holy Spirit for this present age.

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Figuratively baptism represents identification with a new state.

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Figuratively baptism represents identification with a new state.

Therefore BHS identification with Christ in His death, burial, and resurrection—our new position in Christ, and our new identity in Christ.

1. The BHS is uniquely the work of the Holy Spirit for this present age.

Acts 1:5, "for John truly baptized with water, but you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now."

Acts 2:2, "And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled [πληρόω pleroo] the whole house where they were sitting.

Acts 2:3, "Then there appeared to them divided tongues, as of fire, and one sat upon each of them.

Acts 2:4, "And they were all filled [πίμπλημι *pimplemi*] with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance."

2. The BHS is the unique mark of the church. Thus, all Church Age Christians are baptized by the Holy Spirit.

3. The BHS is often confused with the indwelling of the Holy Spirit (HS) and the filling of the HS, but these are distinct ministries.

4. In the Pentecostal and Charismatic movements this is a second work of grace after salvation and is evidenced by speaking in tongues. This is completely *false*.

In the "Third Wave" (Vineyard, Signs and Wonders) it can also be at salvation, but is not connected to the gift of tongues.

5. Major passages are: Matt. 3:11; Mark 1:8; Luke 3:16; John 1:33; Acts 1:5; 11:16; Rom. 6:1-4; 1 Cor. 12:13; Gal. 3:27; Eph. 4:5; Col. 2:12.

6. BHS occurs for every believer at the instant of salvation and is not experienced, it is only learned by studying the Bible.

1 Cor. 12:13, "For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free—and have all been made to drink into one Spirit."

7. There is no command to be baptized by the Spirit.

8. BHS is what places us into the Body of Christ by identifying us with His death, burial, and resurrection.
Rom. 6:3–4; Col. 2:12

9. Tongues only accompanied it at Pentecost with all of those present, with the Gentiles in Acts 10:46, and with the disciples of John in Ephesus in Acts 19.

10. The only two mentions of the BHS in Acts are in Acts 2 and Acts 11:15–16.

Acts 11:15, "And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them, as upon us at the beginning.

Acts 11:16, "Then I remembered the word of the Lord, how He said, 'John indeed baptized with water, but you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit.'"

Matt. 3:11, "As for me, I baptize you with water for repentance, but He who is coming after me is mightier than I, and I am not fit to remove His sandals; He will baptize you by means of the Holy Spirit and fire."

Matt. 3:11, "As for me, I baptize [presactive ind] you with water [en hudati] for [eis] repentance, but He who is coming after me is mightier than I, and I am not fit to remove His sandals; He will baptize you by means of the Holy Spirit [en pneumati] and fire."

Luke 3:16, "John answered, saying to all, 'I indeed baptize you with [en hudati] water; but One mightier than I is coming, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to loose. He will baptize [future act indicative] you with the Holy Spirit [en pneumati] and fire."

Matt. 3:11, "As for me, I baptize [presactive ind] you with water [en hudati] for [eis] repentance, but He who is coming after me is mightier than I, and I am not fit to remove His sandals; He will baptize you by means of the Spirit [en pneumati] and fire."

1. John compares what he does with water to what Jesus will do in the future with the HS and with fire.

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- 2. Just as John used water as the means [en] to identify the repentant person with the coming kingdom ...

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so Jesus in the future will use the HS [en] to identify the new believer with His own death, burial, and resurrection and place the believer into the body of Christ and in Himself.

Acts 1:5, "for John baptized [act] with water [en hudati], but you will be baptized [future passive] by means of the Holy Spirit [en pneumati] not many days from now."

1 Cor. 12:13, "For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free—and have all been made to drink into one Spirit."

1 Cor. 12:13, "For by means of one Spirit [en pneumati] we were all baptized [aor pass ind] into [eis] one body, whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free, and we were all made to drink of one Spirit."

hupo indicates the one who performs the action of a passive voice verb.

Therefore, en indicates the instrument or means used, not the one who performs the action: The Holy Spirit does not baptize anyone.

- 1. John compares what he does with water to what Jesus will do in the future with the HS and with fire.
- 2. Just as John used water as the means to identify the repentant person with the coming kingdom ...

so Jesus in the future will use the HS [en] to identify the new believer with His own death, burial, and resurrection and place the believer into the body of Christ and in Himself.

Gal. 3:27, "For all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ.

Gal. 3:28, "There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free man, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus."

Rom. 6:3, "Or do you not know that as many of us as were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death?

Rom. 6:4, "Therefore we were buried with Him through baptism into death, that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life."

The baptism by means of the HS is the work of Christ whereby at the moment of faith alone in Christ alone, Christ uses the HS (in the act of regeneration) to identify the believer with the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ. So that he becomes a new creature in Christ, where the power of the sin nature is broken, but the presence of the sin nature is not removed until death or the Rapture, whichever comes first.
