

What the Bible Teaches About Restraining

2 Thess. 2:6, "And now you know what is restraining, that he may be revealed in his own time.

2 Thess. 2:7, "For the mystery of lawlessness is already at work; only He who now restrains will do so until He is taken out of the way."

κατέχω *katechon* <u>pres</u> act part neut sing acc BDAG: "to prevent the doing of something or cause to be ineffective, *prevent, hinder, restrain*" The one who restrains

As a work of common grace, God the Holy Spirit restrains evil and lawlessness during this Church Age, in order to provide stable environments for evangelism, spiritual growth, and missions.

The Holy Spirit restrains through government, through the presence of the Church, through thwarting Satan in his designs, through individual conscience, and providential prevention of the evil plans of human beings.

What the Bible Teaches About Convicting Unbelievers

Jn. 16:8, "And when He has come, He will convict the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment:

Jn. 16:9, "of sin, because they do not believe in Me;

Jn. 16:10, "of righteousness, because I go to My Father and you see Me no more;

Jn. 16:11, "of judgment, because the ruler of this world is judged."

The problem: we are born spiritually dead

Eph. 2:1, "And you were dead in your trespasses and sins,"

What is spiritual death?

Separation from the life of God, Eph. 4:18.

Eph. 4:18, "having their understanding darkened, being alienated from the life of God, because of the ignorance that is in them, because of the blindness of their heart;"

John 3:3, "Jesus answered and said to him, 'Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God.'"

John 1:12, "But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name:

What the Bible Teaches About

The Baptism by the Holy Spirit

The baptism by means of the Holy Spirit is the work of Christ whereby at the moment of faith alone in Christ alone Christ uses the Holy Spirit to identify the believer with His death, burial, and resurrection and places the believer into the body of Christ, the Church, as the Holy Spirit builds a new temple, which is the body of Christ. (Rom. 6:3-6)

EIGHT Types of Baptisms

WET

- 1. John the Baptist's baptism
- 2. Jesus' baptism
- 3. Christian baptism

Nicander, 200 BC Recipe for making pickles

First, the vegetable should be 'dipped' (bapto) into boiling water.

Second, and then 'baptized' (baptizo) in the vinegar solution.

In the first the vegetable is immersed, but it is still a cucumber.

In the second, the vegetable is changed by the vinegar.

EIGHT Types of Baptisms

WET: Ritual Baptisms

- 1. John the Baptist's baptism
- 2. Jesus' baptism
- 3. Christian baptism

DRY: Real Baptisms Identification

- 1. Baptism into Moses, 1 Cor. 10:2
- 2. Baptism into Noah, 1 Pet. 3:21
- 3. Baptism of the cross
- 4. Baptism by the HS
- 5. Baptism by fire

Bapto literally means or denotes dipping, plunging or immersing something into a liquid.

Baptizo suggests a more figurative sense that something is identified by something to indicate a change.

Baptism of the Spirit

Never expressed in the Greek, never is baptism expressed by the genitive of pneuma

These all translate the <u>exact same</u> phrase in the Greek.

Are there two baptisms: one WITH the Spirit and one BY the Spirit?

Mark 1:8, "I indeed baptized you with water, but He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." (NKJV)

Luke 3:16, "John answered, saying to all, 'I indeed baptize you with water; but One mightier than I is coming, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to loose. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire." (NKJV)

In these two sentences, who performs the baptism?

- 1. "Him" (John the Baptist) is the one who performs the baptizing.
- 2. "You" (Jesus) is the one who performs the baptizing.

Grammatically, the one who performs the action of a passive voice verb is the <u>agent</u>.

In English we use the preposition "by" with a passive verb, to indicate the one who performs the action.

"Jesus came ... to by baptized by him."

But in Greek, the preposition that designates the agent performing the action is *hupo*.

1 Cor. 12:13, "For by means of one Spirit [en pneumati] we were all baptized [aorist passive indicative] into [eis] one body, whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free, and we were all made to drink of one Spirit."

1 Cor. 12:13 does not use the preposition *hupo* in Greek, therefore, the Holy Spirit is not the one performing the action of the passive verb baptized.

Matt. 3:11, "As for me, I baptize [present active indicative] you with water [en hudati] for [eis] repentance, but He who is coming after me is mightier than I, and I am not fit to remove His sandals; He will baptize you by means of [en pneumati] the Spirit and fire."

In Matt. 3:11, the subject of the active voice verb "baptize" is "I" (John the Baptist) in the first instance. And it is "He" (Jesus Christ) the second time. It is Jesus Christ who performs the action of baptism by means of the Holy Spirit and fire.

Matthew 3:11, "I on the one hand baptize you with water unto repentance: but HE who is coming after me is mightier than I, whose shoes I am not worthy to bear: HE shall baptize you with the Holy Spirit, and with fire:" ~RD

Acts 1:5, "for John baptized [active] with water [en hudati], but you will be baptized [future active] by means of the Holy Spirit [en pneumati] not many days from now."

1 Cor. 10:2, "and all were baptized [aorist passive] into [eis] Moses in [en] the cloud and in [en] the sea;"



There is one baptism by means of the Holy Spirit.

Christ performs the Baptism.

The instrument used to effect the identification is the Spirit.

The new condition is into the body of Christ, identification with Christ in His death, burial, and resurrection.

John 14:16, "And I will pray the Father, and He will give you another Helper, that He may abide with you forever—"

John 14:26, "But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all things that I said to you."

John 15:26, "But when the Helper comes, whom I shall send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who proceeds from the Father, He will testify of Me."

John 16:7, "Nevertheless I tell you the truth. It is to your advantage that I go away; for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you; but if I depart, I will send Him to you."

The baptism by means of the Holy Spirit is the work of Christ whereby at the moment of faith alone in Christ alone Christ uses the Holy Spirit to identify the believer with His death, burial, and resurrection and places the believer into the body of Christ, the Church, as the Holy Spirit builds a new temple, which is the body of Christ. (Rom. 6:3-6)

Gal. 3:27, "For all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ.

Gal. 3:28, "There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free man, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus."

Rom. 6:3, "Or do you not know that as many of us as were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death?

Rom. 6:4, "Therefore we were buried with Him through baptism into death, that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life."

The baptism by means of the Holy Spirit is the work of Christ whereby at the moment of faith alone in Christ alone Christ uses the Holy Spirit (in the act of regeneration) to identify the believer with the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ. So that he becomes a new creature in Christ.
