





Key Principles that Inform Child Training:

- a. God institutes spheres of authority within the creation.
- b. At birth, parents are given the responsibility to train children to restrain their sin natures. This emphasizes the importance of obedience to authorities.
- c. Without authority orientation, life can become quite chaotic and self-destructive.
- d. The key is to teach humility which is learned through enforced humility.
- e. Only through Scripture can we have a healthy view of authority and obedience.

<u>Rom. 13:1</u>, "Let every soul be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and the authorities that exist are appointed by God.

<u>Rom. 13:2</u>, "Therefore whoever resists the authority resists the ordinance of God, and those who resist will bring judgment on themselves."
