2B <u>God refutes the false teachers denial</u> of the literal Second Advent, <u>2 Peter 3:3–14</u>

Conclusion: Warning and Challenge Do not fall into error, but grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. 2 Peter 3:15–18 <u>2 Pet. 3:2</u>, "that you may be mindful of the words which <u>were spoken before</u> by the holy prophets, and of the commandment of us, the apostles of the Lord and Savior,"

"in order to remind you"

προλέγω *prolegō* perf pass part neut plur gen to say ahead of time; foretell, predict

γινώσκω ginōskō pres act part masc plur nom **anarthrous** to know, come to know, recognize see same language in 2 Pet. 1:20 imperatival "First of all you must know this:"

πρῶτος *prōtos* first, prominent, former, first in a list, cf., the parallel in 1:20, emphasizes priority <u>2 Pet. 3:3</u>, "knowing this first: that <u>scoffers</u> will come in the last days, walking according to their own lusts,"

έμπαιγμονή empaigmon \bar{e} v. fem sing dat mocking, scoffing, deriding, despising, ridiculing; literally "scoffing, they will scoff" **"They will surely** scoff," or "blatantly scoff" (~NET)

ἐμπαίκτης; empaiktēs n.mocker, a scoffer, someone who ridicules or speaks about something in a scornfully derisive way (COED)..., belittle, deride, despise, laugh at, make fun of, ridicule, revile

<u>2 Pet. 3:3</u>, "knowing this first: that scoffers will come in the last days, walking according to their own <u>lusts</u>,"

ἔρχομαι erchomai plur fut mid indic "to come, go" "they [scoffers] will come"

πορεύομαι *poreuomai* pres mid part masc plur nom to go, primarily to travel or journey in a certain direction ἐπιθυμία epithumia fem plur acc desire, lust following their arrogance <u>2 Pet. 3:4,</u> "and saying, 'Where is the promise of His coming? For since the fathers fell asleep, all things continue as they were from the beginning of creation.'" <u>2 Pet. 3:4,</u> "and saying, 'Where is the promise of His coming? The main issue is the return of Jesus Christ.

Second Coming

<u>Matt. 24:3</u>, "Now as He sat on the Mount of Olives, the disciples came to Him privately, saying, 'Tell us, when will these things be? And what will be the sign of Your coming, and of the end of the age?'"

Matt. 24:27, "For as the lightning comes from the east and flashes to the west, so also will the coming of the Son of Man be."

Matt. 24:37, "But as the days of Noah were, so also will the coming of the Son of Man be."

Matt. 24:39, "and did not know until the flood came and took them all away, so also will <u>the</u> <u>coming of the Son of Man be</u>."

Rapture

<u>1 Cor. 15:23</u>, "But each one in his own order: Christ the firstfruits, afterward those <u>who are</u> <u>Christ's at His coming</u>."

<u>1 Thess. 2:19</u>, "For what is our hope, or joy, or crown of rejoicing? Is it not even you in the presence of our Lord Jesus Christ at His coming?"

<u>1 Thess. 4:15,</u> "For this we say to you by the word of the Lord, that <u>we who are alive and</u> <u>remain until the coming of the Lord</u> will by no means precede those who are asleep." The Olivet Discourse is Jesus' last words to Israel.

The Upper Room Discourse is Jesus' first words to the Church.

Matt. 24:3, "Now as He sat on the Mount of **Olives, the disciples** came to Him privately, saying, 'Tell us, when will these things be? And what will be the sign of Your coming, and of the end of the age?' "

<u>Matt. 24:3</u>, "Now as He sat on the Mount of Olives, the disciples came to Him privately, saying, 'Tell us, (1) when will these things be? And (2) what will be the sign of Your coming, and of the end of the age?'"

Mark 13:3, "Now as He sat on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter, James, John, and Andrew asked Him privately,

Mark 13:4, "'Tell us, (1) when will these things be? (2) And what will be the sign when all these things will be fulfilled?" "They have nothing to do with the church, which Jesus said He would build (Matt. 16:18). <u>The church is not present in any</u> <u>sense in chapters 24 and 25</u>. The disciples' questions related to Jerusalem, Israel, and the Lord's second coming in glory to establish His kingdom."

2. Who is taken and who is left behind in Matt. 24:40–42?

Rationale for 360-Day Years

- Half week—Daniel 9:27
- **Time, times, half a time** Daniel 7:25, 12:7; Rev. 12:14
- 1,260 days—Revelation 12:6, 11:3
- 42 months—Revelation 11:2, 13:5
- Thus: 42 months = 1,260 days = time, times, half a time + half week
- Therefore: month = 30 days; year = 360 days

Explanation of Daniel's 70 Weeks of Years

- 69 × 7 × 360 = 173,880 days
- March 5, 444 B.C. + 173,880 = March 30, A.D. 33

Verification

• 444 B.C. to A.D. 33 -1 (no year 0) = 476 years

• 476 years × 365.2421989 days = 173,855 days
 + days between March 5 and March 30 = 25 days

2. The second 3.5 years of Daniel's seventieth week: increased persecution of Jews after the Antichrist breaks the covenant; Matt. 24:9–12.

3. The warning to flee to avoid the increased persecution of the second half of the Tribulation; Matt. 24:15–22.

Matt. 24:15, " 'Therefore when you see the "abomination of desolation," spoken of by Daniel the prophet, standing in the holy place' (whoever reads, let him understand),"



Matt. 24:21, "For then there will be great tribulation, such as has not been since the beginning of the world until this time, no, nor ever shall be."
