

#### The Word *Palestinian*

➤ Word created by the Greeks to designate the territory of the <a href="Philistines">Philistines</a> – a <a href="mailto:geographical">geographical</a> designation

➤ It is deliberately applied to all of Israel by the Romans (basically southern Syria) — a geographical designation

## The Word *Palestinian*

- ➤ During the British Mandate (1920-48) it referred to part of the geographical area under British control
  - ✓ Jewish Palestinians
  - ✓ Arab Palestinians

#### The Word Palestinian

- After the re-formation of Israel in 1948 and the formation of the PLO in the 1960s, the word increasingly came to be used ethnically of Arab Palestinians
  - ✓ This was for political reasons
  - ✓ There has never been a true ethnic group called <u>Palestinians</u>

## Social Gospel: Walter Rauschenbusch

"redemption of society from political autocracies and economic oligarchies; the substitution of redemptive for vindictive penology; the abolition of constraint through hunger as part of the industrial system; and the abolition of war"



A Theology for the Social Gospel

#### Theological Interpretation of Scripture (TIS)

- Reading the Bible with a <u>preconceived agenda</u> or theological point already in mind
- Existence of God, Deity of Christ, Inerrancy of the Bible
- > Trinity, Church (communitarian), Already-Not Yet
- Various forms of liberation theology

Sloganized verses: Let my people go; the truth shall make you free

Christian Palestinian Liberation Theology is an agenda-driven approach to using the Bible and Christian theology to advance the defeat of the government (Israel) which is oppressing the Palestinian people (Muslim & Christian Arabs).

# Statement by Arab Mayor (Muslim) of Nablus after 1982 Invasion of Lebanon by Israel

No one was surprised by the criminal attack on Lebanon

It is a continuation of Israel's policy aimed at exterminating our people, physically and politically

It is a continuation of the battle started by Israel at the very beginning when it considered the land to be its land

And sought to build a "pure" Israel without the inhabitants



### Two Ways the Arab Narrative is Being Spread

POLITICAL PRESSURE (BDS): BOYCOTT, DIVEST, SANCTION

THEOLOGICAL PRESSURE: LIBERATION THEOLOGY

# Boycott, Divest, and Sanction (BDS)

- Boycott purchase of Israel products
- Goal is anti-Israel thinking drawing an analogy between the <u>apartheid of South Africa</u> and the <u>apartheid of Israel</u>
- Attempt to keep Israeli speakers (academics, doctors, etc.) from speaking at conferences or publishing in journals
- Bombarding college campuses (especially in Britain and the USA) with anti-Israel propaganda

#### Anti-Semitism on University Campuses

#### Examples:

- 1. Students of Color Conference (SOCC)
- 2. Students for Justice in Palestine (SJP)
- 3. Middle Eastern Studies typically leave out any emphasis on Jews and Israel

#### Students of Color Conferences

"Over the course of what was probably no longer than an hour, my history was denied, the murder of my people was justified, and a movement whose sole purpose is the destruction of the Jewish homeland was glorified."

"Statements were made justifying the ruthless murder of innocent Israeli civilians, blatantly denying the Holocaust in which six million Jews were murdered. Why anyone in their right mind would accept these slanders as truths baffles me. But they did. These statements, and others, were met with endless snaps and cheers. I was taken aback." - Arielle, Jewish student

# Students for Justice in Palestine

- A chapter of SJP was suspended at Northeastern University in 2014
  - ✓ Defaced a statue of a Jewish donor
  - ✓ Disrupting Holocaust awareness events



#### Theological Pressure: Liberation Theology

#### **Liberation Theology**

- Focus on political deliverance usually through nonviolent means
- Started in the middle of the 20<sup>th</sup> century
- Latin America/Roman Catholic
- Bible sloganized, not interpreted and practiced

#### **Evangelical Theology**

- High view of the Bible
- High view of Christ
- Focus on salvation by grace alone through faith alone in Christ alone
- Attempt to practice the Bible

#### Christian Palestinianism

- ➤ A form of liberation theology focusing on the oppression of the Palestinian Arabs (both Muslims and Christians) by Israel and their need for political deliverance
- ➤ A movement of professing Christians from the liberal side of the spectrum
- Social justice is the key issue

#### Father of Christian Palestinianism Naim Ateek

- > Palestinian Arab
- > Anglican Priest
- Wrote the key book:

Justice and Only Justice: A Palestinian Theology of Liberation



#### In 1989 Ateek founded Sabeel



- Sabeel is an ecumenical organization
- Promotes the Arab narrative that Israel is an apartheid nation
- Supports BDS movement



1. Propagation of a Palestinianized version of Roman Catholic liberation theology


# SABEEL

- Has written books against Zionism and against Israel

- Stephen Sizer
- Speaker at both Sabeel and Christ at the Checkpoint
- Retired Anglican minister
- Anti-Semitic & Anti-Zionist
- Has spoken at a pro-Hezbollah conference



#### Note the Replacement Theology of CATC

"We do not condemn the Jewish people and we reject any forms of anti-Semitism. In fact, many of our supporters are Israeli Jews who believe that the present Israeli treatment of the Palestinians does not reflect the deeper moral values of Judaism itself."

"We simply wish to find a life in the entire Holy Land that is free of discrimination and injustice, where each person can live without prejudice toward their race or religion."

"This also means we reject theologies that lead to discrimination or privileges based on ethnicity. Worldviews that promote divine national entitlement or exceptionalism do not promote the values of the Kingdom of God because they place nationalism above Jesus."

#### One for Israel says this about CATC:

CATC's "true purpose is to fundamentally change the way that Evangelicals in the West read the Bible in order to fundamentally change their political stand regarding the Arab-Israeli conflictand through them, to affect their political leaders."

Literal Interpretation

**Embrace Dispensationalism** 

You will support Zionism

Your love for Jewish people will grow

Do <u>not</u> accept all the actions of the present Israeli government as right just because it is Israel.



Oppose BDS and Christian Palestinian Liberation Theology at every opportunity
