

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Dt. 2:34, "We took all his cities at that time, and we <u>utterly destroyed</u> the men, women, and little ones of every city; we left none remaining.

Dt. 2:35, "We took only the livestock as plunder for ourselves, with the spoil of the cities which we took."

Dt. 3:3, "So the Lord our God also delivered into our hands Og king of Bashan, with all his people, and we attacked him until he had no survivors remaining.

Dt. 3:4, "And we took all his cities at that time; there was not a city which we did not take from them: sixty cities, all the region of Argob, the kingdom of Og in Bashan."

Dt. 3:5, "All these cities were fortified with high walls, gates, and bars, besides a great many rural towns.

Dt. 3:6, "And we utterly destroyed them, as we did to Sihon king of Heshbon, utterly destroying the men, women, and children of every city."

Dt. 3:22, "You must not fear them, for the Lord your God Himself fights for you."

Dt. 6:3, "Therefore hear, O Israel, and be careful to observe it, that it may be well with you, and that you may multiply greatly as the Lord God of your fathers has promised you—'a land flowing with milk and honey."

Dt. 6:17, "You shall diligently keep the commandments of the Lord your God, His testimonies, and His statutes which He has commanded you.

Dt. 6:18, "And you shall do what is right and good in the sight of the Lord, that it may be well with you, and that you may go in and possess the good land of which the Lord swore to your fathers,

Dt. 6:19, "to cast out all your enemies from before you, as the Lord has spoken."

Dt. 7:1, "When the Lord your God brings you into the land which you go to possess, and has cast out many nations before you, the Hittites and the Girgashites and the Amorites and the Canaanites and the Perizzites and the Hivites and the Jebusites, seven nations greater and mightier than you,

Dt. 7:2, "and when the Lord your God delivers them over to you, you shall conquer them and utterly destroy them. You shall make no covenant with them nor show mercy to them.

Dt, 7:3, "Nor shall you make marriages with them. You shall not give your daughter to their son, nor take their daughter for your son."

Dt. 7:4, "For they will turn your sons away from following Me, to serve other gods; so the anger of the Lord will be aroused against you and destroy you suddenly.

Dt. 7:5, "But thus you shall deal with them: you shall destroy their altars, and break down their sacred pillars, and cut down their wooden images, and burn their carved images with fire.

Dt. 7:6, "For you are a holy people to the Lord your God; the Lord your God has chosen you to be a people for Himself, a special treasure above all the peoples on the face of the earth."

Dt. 7:13, "And He will love you and bless you and multiply you; He will also bless the fruit of your womb and the fruit of your land, your grain and your new wine and your oil, the increase of your cattle and the offspring of your flock, in the land of which He swore to your fathers to give you.

Dt. 7:14, "You shall be blessed above all peoples; there shall not be a male or female barren among you or among your livestock."

Dt. 7:15, "And the Lord will take away from you all sickness, and will afflict you with none of the terrible diseases of Egypt which you have known, but will lay them on all those who hate you.

Dt. 7:16, "Also you shall destroy all the peoples whom the Lord your God delivers over to you; your eye shall have no pity on them; nor shall you serve their gods, for that will be a snare to you.

Dt. 7:17, "If you should say in your heart, 'These nations are greater than I; how can I dispossess them?'—

Dt. 7:18, "you shall not be afraid of them, but you shall remember well what the Lord your God did to Pharaoh and to all Egypt:"

Dt. 7:19, "the great trials which your eyes saw, the signs and the wonders, the mighty hand and the outstretched arm, by which the Lord your God brought you out. So shall the Lord your God do to all the peoples of whom you are afraid.

Dt. 7:20, "Moreover the Lord your God will send the hornet among them until those who are left, who hide themselves from you, are destroyed.

Dt. 7:21, "You shall not be terrified of them; for the Lord your God, the great and awesome God, is among you."

Dt. 7:22, "And the Lord your God will drive out those nations before you little by little; you will be unable to destroy them at once, lest the beasts of the field become too numerous for you.

Dt. 7:23, "But the Lord your God will deliver them over to you, and will inflict defeat upon them until they are destroyed.

Dt. 7:24, "And He will deliver their kings into your hand, and you will destroy their name from under heaven; no one shall be able to stand against you until you have destroyed them."

Dt. 7:25, "You shall burn the carved images of their gods with fire; you shall not covet the silver or gold that is on them, nor take it for yourselves, lest you be snared by it; for it is an abomination to the Lord your God.

Dt. 7:26, "Nor shall you bring an abomination into your house, lest you be doomed to destruction like it. You shall utterly detest it and utterly abhor it, for it is an accursed thing."

Dt. 9:6, "Therefore understand that the Lord your God is not giving you this good land to possess because of your righteousness, for you are a stiffnecked people."

Dt. 20:16, "But of the cities of these peoples which the Lord your God gives you as an inheritance, you shall let nothing that breathes remain alive,

Dt. 20:17, "but you shall utterly destroy them: the Hittite and the Amorite and the Canaanite and the Perizzite and the Hivite and the Jebusite, just as the Lord your God has commanded you,

Dt. 20:18, "lest they teach you to do according to all their abominations which they have done for their gods, and you sin against the Lord your God."



Jdg. 1:14, "Now it happened, when she came to him, that she urged him to ask her father for a field. And she dismounted from her donkey, and Caleb said to her, 'What do you wish?'

Jdg. 1:15, "So she said to him, 'Give me a blessing; since you have given me land in the South, give me also springs of water.' And Caleb gave her the upper springs and the lower springs."

Jdg. 1:16, "Now the children of the Kenite, Moses' father-in-law, went up from the City of Palms with the children of Judah into the Wilderness of Judah, which lies in the South near Arad; and they went and dwelt among the people.

Jdg. 1:20, "And they gave Hebron to Caleb, as Moses had said. Then he expelled from there the three sons of Anak."

Jdg. 1:21, "But the children of Benjamin did not drive out the Jebusites who inhabited Jerusalem; so the Jebusites dwell with the children of Benjamin in Jerusalem to this day."

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

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


Josh. 17:16, "But the children of Joseph said, 'The mountain country is not enough for us; and all the Canaanites who dwell in the land of the valley have chariots of iron, both those who are of Beth Shean and its towns and those who are of the Valley of Jezreel."



Excavations at Dor 1:27

Jdg. 1:28, "And it came to pass, when Israel was strong, that they put the Canaanites under tribute, but <u>did not</u> completely drive them out.

Jdg. 1:31, "Nor did Asher drive out the inhabitants of Acco or the inhabitants of Sidon, or of Ahlab, Achzib, Helbah, Aphik, or Rehob.

Jdg. 1:32, "So the Asherites dwelt among the Canaanites, the inhabitants of the land; for they did not drive them out."

Jdg. 1:33, "Nor did Naphtali drive out the inhabitants of Beth Shemesh or the inhabitants of Beth Anath; but they dwelt among the Canaanites, the inhabitants of the land. Nevertheless the inhabitants of Beth Shemesh and Beth Anath were put under tribute to them.

Jdg. 1:34, "And the Amorites forced the children of Dan into the mountains, for they would not allow them to come down to the valley;"





Jdg. 1:35, "and the Amorites were determined to dwell in Mount Heres, in Aijalon, and in Shaalbim; yet when the strength of the house of Joseph became greater, they were put under tribute.

Jdg. 1:36, "Now the boundary of the Amorites was from the Ascent of Akrabbim, from Sela, and upward."
