

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Philippians What is an Overcomer? Philippians 1:6; 1 John 5:4



Php. 1:5, "for your fellowship in the gospel from the first day until now,


Php. 1:6, "being confident of this very thing, that He who has begun a good work in you will complete it <u>until the day of Jesus Christ;</u>" ~NKJV

Php. 1:10, "that you may approve the things that are excellent, that you may be sincere and without offense till the day of Christ,"

Php. 2:16, "holding fast the word of life, so that I may rejoice in the day of Christ that I have not run in vain or labored in vain."

1 Cor. 1:8, "who will also confirm you to the end, that you may be blameless in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ."

2 Cor. 1:14, "(as also you have understood us in part), that we are your boast as you also are ours, in the day of the Lord Jesus."




- 1. The Day of Christ is different from the Day of the Lord.
 - a. The Day of the Lord describes a time of judgment;
 - b. the *Day of Christ* is when Christ comes for His own at the Rapture, which is immediately followed by the Judgment Seat of Christ when we are rewarded.

- 2 Cor. 5:9, "Therefore we make it our aim, whether present or absent, to be well pleasing to Him.
- 2 Cor. 5:10, "For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may receive the things done in the body, according to what he has done, whether good or bad.
- 2 Cor. 5:11, "Knowing, therefore, the terror of the Lord, we persuade men; but we are well known to God, and I also trust are well known in your consciences."

2. Terminology: 2 Cor. 5:9-11

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2 Cor. 5:10

"For we must all appear before the judgment seat [$\beta \hat{\eta} \mu \alpha \ b \bar{e} m a$] of Christ, so that each one may be recompensed for his deeds in the body, according to what he has done, whether good or bad."

3. Two types of people at the Bema.

1 Cor. 3:14, "If anyone's work which he has built on it endures, he will receive a reward.

1 Cor. 3:15, "If anyone's work is burned, he will suffer loss; but he himself will be saved, yet so as through fire."

4. Two types of heirs.

Romans 8:17, "and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and joint-heirs with Christ, if indeed we suffer with Him, that we may also be glorified together."

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Two types of heirs:

- Heirs of God: all believers
- Joint heirs with Christ: for those who grow spiritually

Conclusions

- 1. Every Christian builds on the foundation of their salvation: faith in Jesus Christ as the promised and prophesied Messiah, who like the Passover Lamb, died as a sacrifice to take away the sin of the world.
- 2. We build with moral works which God has nothing to do with (wood, hay, straw), or we build by walking by the Spirit (Gal. 5:16) and those divinely enabled works have eternal value (gold, silver, precious stones).
- 3. In this life we cannot determine which is which.
- 4. Our life's work will be evaluated at the judgment seat of Christ (JSC).

Conclusions

- 5. The judgment is not designed to expose sin, but to expose that which has eternal value. Sin was paid for (expiation, redemption) at the cross.
- 6. The metaphor of burning destroys that which was temporal to reveal that which is eternal.
- 7. Rewards are on the basis of what is eternal.
- 8. Some have no valued works, yet they "will be saved, yet so as through fire."
- 9. Conclusion: two types of Christians enter Heaven, those with rewards, and those with no rewards.

6. Salvation is not a reward!

Col. 3:23, "And whatever you do, do it heartily, as to the Lord and not to men,

Col. 3:24, "because you know that from the Lord you will receive the reward of the inheritance; for you serve the Lord Christ."

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Salvation is free, unearned, undeserved.

Rewards are based on "doing."

- 8. Disqualification is the opposite of approved.
 - 1 Corinthians 9:24, "Do you not know that those who run in a race all run, but only one receives the prize? Run in such a way that you may win.
 - 1 Corinthians 9:25, "Everyone who competes in the games exercises self-control in all things. They then do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable."

1 Corinthians 9:25, "Everyone who competes in the games exercises self-control in all things. They then do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable.

1 Corinthians 9:26, "Therefore I run thus: not with uncertainty. Thus I fight: not as one who beats the air."

1 Corinthians 9:27, "But I discipline my body and bring it into subjection, lest, when I have preached to others, I myself should become <u>disqualified</u>."

ἀδόκιμος *adokimos* masc sing nom <u>unqualified</u>, worthless, unacceptable

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1 Cor. 3:13, "each one's work will become clear; for the Day will declare it, because it will be revealed by fire; and the fire will test each one's work, of what sort it is."

δοκιμάζω dokimazō 3 sing fut act indic to evaluate, approve, to qualify

- 1. Every believer is competing in the games.
- 2. We are not competing against one another, but against the standard of righteousness, living by the Holy Spirit. None will be perfect, but some are disqualified.
- 3. Disqualification is not a loss of salvation, but the loss of the prize—the imperishable crown.

Revelation 3:21, "To him who overcomes I will grant to sit with Me on My throne, as I also overcame and sat down with My Father on His throne."

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νικάω nikaō
articular pres act ptcp
"victors, winners, conquerors, overcomers"
Cognate to the noun, νίκη nikē, "victory, success."
Nikao "to overpower, to gain victory, to win"

Two views:

1. Every true believer is an overcomer.

2. Only believers who advance in the Christian life are overcomers.

1 John 5:4, "For whatever is born of God overcomes the world; and this is the victory that has overcome the world — our faith.

1 John 5:5, "Who is he who overcomes the world, but he who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?"

1 John 2:29, "If you know that He is righteous, you know that everyone who practices righteousness is [has already been] born of Him." ~RD

Perfect tense: completed action in past time; 10 times this verb is used in 1 John; each time it is in the perfect tense.

This isn't quite the same, because it is the finite verb.

1 John 3:9, "Whoever has been born of God does not sin, for His seed remains in him; and he cannot sin, because he has been born of God."

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1 John 3:9, "Whoever has been born of God does not sin, for His seed remains in him; and he cannot sin, because he has [already] been born of God."

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Perfect tense: completed action in past time;
10 times this verb is used in 1 John; each time it is in the perfect tense.

If "has been born of God" means simple regeneration then no one regenerated can sin— "he cannot sin, because he has been 'regenerated.'"

1 John 4:7, "Beloved, let us love one another, for love is of God; and everyone who loves is (1) born of God and (2) knows God."

γεννάω gennaō
Perfect tense: completed action in past time;
10 times this verb is used in 1 John; each time it is in the perfect tense.

3 sing perf mid/pass indic

Only those born of God and who know God love.

John 14:7, " 'If you had known Me, you would have known My Father also; and from now on you know Him and have seen Him.'

John 14:8, "Philip said to Him, 'Lord, show us the Father, and it is sufficient for us.'

John 14:9, "Jesus said to him, 'Have I been with you so long, and yet you have not known Me, Philip? He who has seen Me has seen the Father; so how can you say, "Show us the Father"?"

- 1 John 2:3, "By this we know that we have come to know Him, if we keep His commandments.
- 1 John 2:4, "The one who says, 'I have already come to know Him,' and does not keep His commandments, is a liar, and the truth is not in him; ~RD
- 1 John 2:5, "but whoever keeps His word, in him the love of God has truly been perfected. By this we know that we are [abiding] in Him:"

1 John 4:7, "Beloved, let us love one another, for love is of God; and everyone who loves is born of God and knows God."

γεννάω gennaō
Perfect tense: completed action in past time;
10 times this verb is used in 1 John; each time it is in the perfect tense.

Only those born of God and who know God love.

Summary

- 1. To know Him is to have love for God.
- 2. Knowing Him is not = believing in Christ as savior.
- 3. Knowing Him is a process that begins at salvation.
- 4. Example: Philip was saved, but did not know Christ, John 14:9.
- 5. Therefore, a believer must come to know God, know His Word, apply His word, to come to love God, which in turn is manifested by biblical love for other believers.
- 6. So the immature believer does not yet know God or love God, which means the immature, or out-of-fellowship believer still spends a lot of time loving the world.

Summary

- 7. The believer who loves one another meets two prerequisites, born from God and knows God.
- 8. 1 John 3:9 tells us that for John the one born from God is not merely someone regenerated, but someone who is living like a regenerated person.

1 John 5:18, "We know that whoever is born of God does not sin; but he who has been born of God keeps himself, and the wicked one does not touch him."
