

The Role of the High Priest

The role of the priest is to represent humans to God. The role of a prophet is to represent God to man.

The legitimate priests in the Old Testament were the ones who took the people before God, interceded for them with God in prayer, and were also to teach them about God. So even before God called Abraham, there were Gentile priests.

 Before Israel the patriarchs of the clan served as priests. The Gentiles had priests, but we don't know much about them. We have two examples:

Ex. 2:16, "Now the priest of Midian had seven daughters. And they came and drew water, and they filled the troughs to water their father's flock."

Ex. 3:1 "Now Moses was tending the flock of <u>Jethro his</u> <u>father-in-law, the priest of Midian</u>. And he led the flock to the back of the desert, and came to Horeb, the mountain of God."

Ex. 18:1, "And Jethro, the priest of Midian, Moses' fatherin-law, heard of all that God had done for Moses and for Israel His people—that the LORD had brought Israel out of Egypt."

2. Earlier, at the time of Abraham, there was another Gentile priest, Melchizedek ("King of righteousness" or righteous king).

 Since God desires all to be saved (1 Tim. 2:3–4; 2 Pet. 3:9) God will bring someone or the message in some form to that person.

- The unbeliever is a spiritually dead person, as such they cannot have a relationship with God.
