God is One and God is Also Three—the Mystery of the Trinity


- 1. God the Father,
- 2. God the Son, and
- 3. God the Holy Spirit

One Essence, Three Persons

Latin "trinitas," coined by an early theologian named Tertullian.

Biblical Creation: Creator-creature Distinction

Where in the Bible do we find these Persons of God?

A. God the Holy Spirit in the Old Testament



<u>Isa. 48:12</u>, " 'Listen to <u>Me</u>, O Jacob, and Israel, My called: <u>I</u> <u>am He</u>, I am the First, I am also the Last.' "

Isa. 48:16, "'Come near to Me, hear this: I have not spoken in secret from the beginning; From the time that it was, I was there. And now the Lord GOD and His Spirit have sent Me.'"

How many persons are here?

- Sovereign LORD (Yahweh): God the Father
- His Spirit: God the Holy Spirit
- The Speaker: God the Son

<u>Isa. 60:22</u>, "A little one shall become a thousand, and a small one a strong nation. I, the <u>LORD</u>, will hasten it in its time."

Isa. 61:1, "The Spirit of the Lord GOD is upon Me, because the LORD has anointed Me to preach good tidings to the poor; He has sent Me to heal the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to those who are bound;"

Gen. 1:1, "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.

Gen. 1:2, "The earth was without form, and void; and darkness was on the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters."


B. God the Son in the Old Testament

The Word

I. Jesus: The Angel of the LORD



Rev. 19:9, "Then he said to me, 'Write: "Blessed are those who are called to the marriage supper of the Lamb!" 'And he said to me, 'These are the true sayings of God.'

Rev. 19:10, "And I fell at his feet to worship him. But he said to me, 'See that you do not do that! I am your fellow servant, and of your brethren who have the testimony of Jesus. Worship God! For the testimony of Jesus is the spirit of prophecy."

First example: Moses at the un-burning bush

Ex. 3:1, "Now Moses was tending the flock of Jethro his father-in-law, the priest of Midian. And he led the flock to the back of the desert, and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. Ex. 3:2, "And the Angel of the LORD appeared to him in a flame of fire from the midst of a bush. So he looked, and behold, the bush was burning with fire, but the bush was not consumed.

Ex. 3:3, "Then Moses said, 'I will now turn aside and see this great sight, why the bush does not burn.'



First example: Moses at the un-burning bush

- Ex. 3:4, "So when the LORD saw that he turned aside to look, God called to him from the midst of the bush and said, 'Moses, Moses!' And he said, 'Here I am.'
- Ex. 3:5, "Then He said, 'Do not draw near this place. Take your sandals off your feet, for the place where you stand is holy ground."
- Ex. 3:6, "Moreover He said, 'I am the God of your father—the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob.' And Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look upon God."

Who is this "angel of the LORD"? He said that He is Yahweh Himself, the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob! Even though God is spirit (John 4:24) and is invisible, when He appears as the Angel of the LORD, humans can see Him.

Second example: Israel at Bochim

When God gave the Israelites the Promised Land, He told them to remove all the Canaanites. However, they disobeyed Him. So the "Angel of the LORD" went to speak to them. He said that He was the one who rescued them from Egypt.

In the Book of Exodus, we know that it was Yahweh Himself who saved Israel from Egypt. But now the Angel of the LORD said that He was the one who did it. Who is this Angel of the LORD? The Bible says the "Angel of the LORD" is Jesus Himself!

Judges 2:1


"The angel of the LORD went up from Gilgal to Bokim and said to the Israelites, 'I brought you out of Egypt into this land that I swore to give your ancestors, and I said I would never break my covenant with you.'"


The angel of the Lord brought Israel out of Egypt

Jesus rescued Israel from Egypt






Third example: David at Araunah's threshing floor


1 Chron. 21:15, "And God sent an angel to Jerusalem to destroy it. As he was destroying, the LORD looked and relented of the disaster, and said to the angel who was destroying, 'It is enough; now restrain your hand.' And the angel of the LORD stood by the threshing floor of Ornan the Jebusite.

1 Chron. 21:16, "Then David lifted his eyes and saw the angel of the LORD standing between earth and heaven, having in his hand a drawn sword stretched out over Jerusalem. So David and the elders, clothed in sackcloth, fell on their faces."

1 Chron. 21:17, "And David said to God, 'Was it not I who commanded the people to be numbered? I am the one who has sinned and done evil indeed; but these sheep, what have they done? Let Your hand, I pray, O LORD my God, be against me and my father's house, but not against Your people that they should be plagued.'

1 Chron. 21:18, "Therefore, the angel of the LORD commanded Gad to say to David that David should go and erect an altar to the LORD on the threshing floor of Ornan the Jebusite."





II. Jesus: the Word of the LORD





John 1:14, "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth."

- rescue people (Psalm 107:20),
- control nature (Psalm 147:15-18), and
- create the universe (Psalm 33:4–9).

C. The Trinity in the New Testament

Matt. 28:18, "And Jesus came and spoke to them, saying, 'All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Matt. 28:19, " 'Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,'"

(See more examples of the three Persons of the Godhead being addressed as God: Acts 5:3–4; 1 Corinthians 2:10–11; 2 Corinthians 13:14; Ephesians 2:18, 4:30; Titus 2:13; 2 Peter 1:21.)


It is Very Important to Know that God is Three and Also One

- III. be with us all the time while still running the universe!




FIRST "Sermon on the Mount"





Misunderstanding of God's Law

Matt. 5:21, "You have heard that it was said to those of old, 'You shall not murder, and whoever murders will be in danger of the judgment.'

Matt. 5:22, "But I say to you that whoever is angry with his brother without a cause shall be in danger of the judgment. And whoever says to his brother, 'Raca!' shall be in danger of the council. But whoever says, 'You fool!' shall be in danger of hell fire."

Matt. 7:28, "And so it was, when Jesus had ended these sayings, that the people were astonished at His teaching, Matt. 7:29, "for He taught them as one having authority, and not as the scribes."
